



82% of Americans believe human-caused pollution contributes to climate change

There is a **staggering one-year increase in voters**— including Republicans — from **39 percent to 53 percent** who say their lives have been impacted by climate change, with older voters more likely to say their lives have been impacted— a 22 percent jump in 55–64-year-olds and 17 percent increase for those 65+.



76% of voters—including **60 percent of Republicans** and **73 percent of independents**— support the federal government taking action to **accelerate the development and deployment of clean energy.**

Voters are more likely to **support a candidate** who endorses **'commonsense' policies** addressing climate change and clean energy

Policies supported by at least 80% of all voters:



Providing tax credits to homeowners to replace home appliances and windows with more energy efficient models.



Holding foreign countries, such as China, responsible for their emission-reduction pledges so that they are comparable to U.S. efforts.



Reducing regulatory and bureaucratic obstacles to build clean energy infrastructure.



Providing tax incentives to businesses to capture carbon emissions.



Providing tax credits for individuals and companies that invest in clean energy generation in the U.S.



Increasing federal government investing in research & development to accelerate the use of battery storage.

METHODOLOGY:

These findings are based on results from a poll conducted by Public Opinion Strategies from February 4-8, 2022. This poll was fielded among 1,000 registered voters nationwide and has a margin of error of +3.53%.
